Solactive Skandia SMART Balanserad Index Vol Target 7

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This document contains the underlying principles and regulations regarding the structure and the operating of the Solactive Skandia SMART Balanserad Index Vol Target 7 ("the Index"). Introduction

This document is to be used as a guideline with regard to the composition, calculation and management of the Solactive Skandia SMART Balanserad Index Vol Target 7. Any changes made to the guideline are initiated by the Committee specified in section 1.6 of this document. The Index is calculated and published by Solactive AG. The name “Solactive” is copyrighted.

1 Index specifications

The Solactive Skandia SMART Balanserad Index Vol Target 7 is calculated and distributed by Solactive AG.

The Index takes a variable exposure to the Skandia SMART Balanserad Fund (ISIN: SE0000810905, Bloomberg SKAPARA SS Equity) with the aim to achieve an annualized volatility of less than or equal to 7%. The Index therefore notionally invests in the Skandia SMART Balanserad Fund and a hypothetical money market position at the Swedish Krona Tomorrow Next STIBOR rate (as published on Reuters under the RIC STISEKTNDFI=, Bloomberg STIB1D Index).

The Index is calculated and published in SEK.

1.1 Short name and ISIN

The Indices are distributed under the following identifiers:

1.2 Initial value

The Indices are launched with a level of 100 at the close on the start date, December 30th 1999. Data before February 28th 2017 is backtested.

1.3 Distribution

The Indices are published via the price marketing services of Boerse Stuttgart AG and are distributed to all affiliated vendors. Each vendor decides on an individual basis as to whether he will distribute/display the Solactive Skandia SMART Balanserad Index Vol Target 7 via his information systems.

1.4 Prices and calculation frequency

The level of the Index is calculated for each Calculation Day on which the Skandia SMART Balanserad Fund is published (such a day being a Publication Day). Should there be no price available on Reuters for any Calculation Day for the Tomorrow Next STIBOR rate, the most recent price on Reuters for the preceding Publication Day is used in the Index calculation.

The Solactive Skandia SMART Balanserad Index Vol Target 7 is calculated every Business Day immediately following a Publication Day at 11:00 am CET. In the event that data cannot be provided to Reuters or to the pricing services of Boerse Stuttgart AG the Index cannot be distributed.

1.5 Weighting

The weights of the index components can change on a daily basis. The weights are adjusted if the target exposure of the index differs from the current exposure by more than 5% in relative value.

The determination of the weights is described in detail in Section 3.

1.6 Decision-making bodies

A Committee composed of staff from Solactive is responsible any amendments to the rules (in this document referred to as the "Index Committee").

1.7 Publication

All specifications and information relevant for calculating the Index are made available on the <http://www.solactive.de> web page and sub-pages.

1.8 Historical data

Historical data will be maintained from the launch of the Index on February 28th 2017

1.9 Licensing

Licences to use the Index as the underlying for investment products issued by stock exchanges, banks, financial services providers and investment houses or for benchmark usage are granted by Solactive AG.

2 Composition of the Index

2.1 Selection of the Index Components

The Index is composed of the following two underlyings (each of them an Underlying Component, together the Underlying Components):

- 1) Skandia SMART Balanserad Fund (Underlying Component 1).
- 2) Swedish Krona Tomorrow Next STIBOR rate (Underlying Component 2).

3 Calculation of the Index

3.1 Index formula

The Index Level for any Calculation Day is determined in accordance with the following formula:

$$IL_t = IL_{t-1} * \left(1 + w_{t-1} * \left(\frac{TR_t}{TR_{t-1}} - 1 \right) + [(1 - w_{t-1}) * (Libor_{t-1} - 0.5\%) - Fee] * \frac{DC_{t,t-1}}{360} \right)$$

with:

IL_t = Index Level as of Calculation Day t

w_{t-1} = Exposure as of Calculation Day t-1

TR_t = The total return time series of the Underlying Component 1 for Calculation Day t

$Libor_{t-1}$ = Level of the Underlying Component 2, expressed as a percentage, for Calculation Day t-1

$DC_{t,t-1}$ = Number of Calendar Days from (and excluding) Calculation Day t-1 to (and including) Calculation Day t

where $Fee = 0.5\%$

TR_t is calculated according to the following formula:

$$TR_t = TR_{t-1} * \frac{(UC_t + Div_t)}{UC_{t-1}}$$

With:

UC_t = The closing price of Underlying Component 1 for Calculation Day t

Div_t = The dividend paid with an ex-date on Calculation Day t

w_t is adjusted according to the following formula:

$$w_t = \begin{cases} \min(1, TW_t) & \text{if } \left| \frac{w_{t-1} - TW_t}{TW_t} \right| > 5\% \\ w_{t-1} & \text{else} \end{cases}$$

with $w_0 = \min\left(1, \frac{TV}{\sigma_0}\right)$, where $TV = 7\%$ and $\sigma_0 = 10.30\%$

TW_t is the target weight, which is calculated according to

$$TW_t = \frac{TV}{\sigma_t}$$

The realized volatility, σ_t , is calculated according to the following formula:

$$\sigma_t = \begin{cases} \max(\sigma_{0.94,t-2}, \sigma_{0.97,t-2}) & \text{if } t > 1 \\ \sigma_0 & \text{else} \end{cases}$$

Where $\sigma_{\lambda,t}^2 = \lambda * \sigma_{\lambda,t-1}^2 + AF * (1 - \lambda) * \left(\ln\left(\frac{TR_t}{TR_{t-1}}\right) \right)^2$

With $\sigma_{0.94,0} = \sigma_{0.97,0} = \sigma_0$ and AF being the annualisation factor of 254.

3.2 Precision

The Index Level will be published with rounding to [4] decimal places.

3.6 Recalculation

4. Definitions

“**Underlying Components**” is the Skandia SMART Balanserad Fund and the Swedish Krona Tomorrow Next STIBOR rate (as published on Reuters under the RIC: STISEKTNDFI=)

A “**Business Day**” is any weekday other than Saturday or Sunday.

A “**Calculation Day**” is any weekday for which the Underlying Component 1 is scheduled to have a Closing Price published.

A “**Publication Day**” is the weekday on which the Closing Price on a Calculation Day is published for the Underlying Component 1.

The “**Target Volatility**” is 7%.

The “**Index Calculator**” is Solactive AG or any other appropriately appointed successor in this function.

The “**Index Currency**” is SEK.

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5.2 Calculation of the Index – change in calculation method

The application by the Index Calculator of the method described in this document is final and binding. The Index Calculator shall apply the method described above for the composition and calculation of the Index Series. The Index Calculator may also make changes to the terms and conditions of the Indices and the method applied to calculate the Indices, which he deems to be necessary and desirable in order to prevent obvious or demonstrable error or to remedy, correct or supplement incorrect terms and conditions. The Index Calculator is not obliged to provide information on any such modifications or changes. Despite the modifications and changes the Index Calculator will take the appropriate steps to ensure a calculation method is applied that is consistent with the method described above.
