ESG Factors Applied in the Benchmark Methodology

List of environmental factors considered	Exclusion of companies not in compliance with UN Global Compact principles.
	> Exclusion of companies generating >10% revenues from the exploration mining or refining of thermal coal.
	> Exclusion of companies that base 30% or more of their operations on thermal coal.
	Exclusion of companies that produce >20 million tons of thermal coal annually and are actively expanding.
List of social factors considered	> Exclusion of companies not in compliance with UN Global Compact principles.
	Exclusion of companies involved in the production development or maintenance of Anti-personnel Mines, Biological or Chemical weapons, Cluster munitions, Depleted uranium, Nuclear Weapons, or any other weapon that violate humanitarian principles through normal use.
	> Exclusion of companies that produce or develop key and dedicated components for controversial weapons.
	> Exclusion of companies involved in the production and/or services tailor made for the defense industry or the military.
	> Exclusion of companies that hold ≥20% stake in a company that is involved in controversial weapons.
	$>$ Exclusion of companies currently $\geq 50\%$ owned by a company that is involved in controversial weapons.
	> Exclusion of companies generating >10% revenue from the production or distribution of arms, both public and private.
	> Exclusion of companies generating > 5% revenues from tobacco manufacturing.



	> Exclusion of companies generating >5% revenue from tobacco distribution and/or sale of tobacco products.
List of governance factors considered	> Exclusion of companies not in compliance with UN Global Compact principles.

Verification and quality of data	The provider of ESG-related data input is selected by the Administrator based on an assessment of its existing processes in order to ensure the reliability and representativeness of the ESG-related data.
