List of environmental factors considered	<ul style="list-style-type: none">> Unconventional Fossil Fuels: exclude companies with more than 5% revenue exposure to coal mining and power generation, hydraulic fracturing, oil&sands as well as any involvement in deep water drilling.> Nuclear Energy: exclude companies with more than 10% of revenues derived from production, distribution or supports of products related to nuclear energy.> Exclusion of companies generating revenues from the production or exploration of oil sands.
List of social factors considered	<ul style="list-style-type: none">> Norms Based Research: exclude companies with verified infringement of established international initiatives and guidelines (such as UN Principles and OECD Guidelines).> Controversial Businesses: exclude companies with more than 10% revenue exposure to gambling, adult entertainment, alcoholic beverages and tobacco products or military equipment.> Controversial Weapons: exclude companies with any exposure to anti-personnel mines, biological and chemical weapons, cluster munitions, depleted uranium as well as nuclear weapons.
List of governance factors considered	<ul style="list-style-type: none">> Unethical practices regarding employees or customers: - A legal judgement or an official ruling regarding discrimination against any employees, or - Two or more legal cases brought against them regarding discrimination against any employees, or - A legal judgement or an official ruling regarding unethical practices in its marketing and advertisement.
