ESG Factors Applied in the Benchmark Methodology

List of environmental factors considered	> The Index is designed to meet the requirements for Climate Transition Benchmarks (CTB) as specified by the Regulation (EU) 2016/1011 and the Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/1818
	> Exclusion of companies classified as having major involvement in the coal industry
	> Exclusion of companies determined to be violators of the UN Global Compact
	> 30% reduction in carbon intensity compared to the investable universe (inclusion of Scope 1 and 2 emissions (Scope 3 to be phased in over a four-year timeframe) in measuring carbon intensity)
	 At least 7% reduction per year in carbon intensity (inclusion of Scope 1 and 2 emissions (Scope 3 to be phased in over a four-year timeframe) in mea- suring carbon intensity)
	> Sufficient exposure to high climate impact sectors (NACE Industry Codes A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, L): at least equal to that of the investable universe
List of social factors considered	> Exclusion of companies determined to be violators of the UN Global Compact
	> Exclusion of companies classified as having major involvement in the fol- lowing industries: tobacco, controversial weapons
List of governance factors considered	> Exclusion of companies determined to be violators of the UN Global Compact

Data Input	The data used to construct the index is sourced externally from ISS



Verification and quality of data	The provider of ESG-related data input is selected by the Index Owner (RAFI Indices) and approved by the Index Administrator (Solactive AG) based on an assessment of its existing processes
