

# EXPLANATION OF HOW KEY ELEMENTS OF THE BENCHMARK METHODOLOGY REFLECT ENVIRONMENTAL, SOCIAL, AND GOVERNANCE (ESG) FACTORS

## ESG Factors Applied in the Benchmark Methodology

<b>List of environmental factors considered</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>&gt; Exclusion of companies that have severe or very severe controversies related to Environment, Human rights, Corruption, Labor rights.</li><li>&gt; Exclusion of companies with Carbon Intensity higher than 1000 (in CO2 equivalent Tons/ USD million revenue). CO2 equivalent Tons are measured as the amount of carbon dioxide equivalent released into the atmosphere as a result of the activities of a particular organization and first tier indirect (GHG emissions from operations that are owned or controlled by the company &amp; from its direct suppliers).</li><li>&gt; Exclusion of companies that have a relative turnover from coal mining or power generation above 1%.</li><li>&gt; The securities remaining after the filters are sorted by their ESG Score. I.e. the security issued by the company with the highest ESG Score receives the highest rank. Afterwards, the 100 securities with the highest rank are selected.</li></ul>
<b>List of social factors considered</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>&gt; Exclusion of companies that have severe or very severe controversies related to Environment, Human rights, Corruption, Labor rights.</li><li>&gt; Exclusion of companies with less than 25% Women on Board.</li><li>&gt; Exclusion of companies that deal with controversial weapons.</li><li>&gt; Exclusion of companies that are involved in Tobacco Cultivation &amp; Production.</li><li>&gt; The securities remaining after the filters are sorted by their ESG Score. I.e. the security issued by the company with the highest ESG Score receives the highest rank. Afterwards, the 100 securities with the highest rank are selected.</li></ul>
<b>List of governance factors considered</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>&gt; Exclusion of companies that have severe or very severe controversies related to Environment, Human rights, Corruption, Labor rights.</li><li>&gt; The securities remaining after the filters are sorted by their ESG Score. I.e.</li></ul>
