

# EXPLANATION OF HOW KEY ELEMENTS OF THE BENCHMARK METHODOLOGY REFLECT ENVIRONMENTAL, SOCIAL, AND GOVERNANCE (ESG) FACTORS

Solactive ISS ESG Global Water Select Index 5% AR



This document provides an explanation of how the key elements of the benchmark methodology reflect ESG factors. List of environmental factors considered	Exclusion of companies with verified ongoing failure to respect established international norms. The core normative framework consists of the Prin- ciples of the UN Global Compact and the OECD Guidelines for Multina- tional Enterprises.
	Exclusion of companies generating revenues (in proportion to their total revenues) >5% from activities in the sector of conventional oil and gas.
	Exclusion of companies generating revenues (in proportion to their total revenues) >0% from activities in the sector of unconventional oil and gas.
	Exclusion of companies generating revenues (in proportion to their total revenues) >5% from activities in the sector of coal, i.e. mining and power generation.
	Exclusion of companies generating revenues (in proportion to their total revenues) >5% from activities in the sector of nuclear power.
	Each security receives two scores, one based on the Sustainable Development Goal 6: Clean Water and Sanitation and one based one the Sustainable Development Goal 14: Life Below Water Scores. Each score is standardized by the respective sector in the index universe. Both scores are standardized by subtracting the average score per sector and dividing by the standard deviation of scores in the respective sector. All securities with a sector standardized Life Below Water Score below or equal to 0 are excluded.

	Exclusion of companies with verified ongoing involvement in the area of controversial weapons (including chemical, biological and nuclear weapon (both under and outside the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear

	Weapons), depleted uranium munitions, cluster munitions, and anti-personne mines).
	Exclusion of companies generating revenues (in proportion to their total revenues) >5% from activities in the sector of tobacco.
	<ul> <li>Exclusion of companies generating revenues (in proportion to their total revenues) &gt;5% from activities in the sector of cannabis.</li> </ul>
	Exclusion of companies generating revenues (in proportion to their total revenues) >5% from activities in the sector of defense and weapons, i.e. military equipment and civilian firearms.
	Exclusion of companies generating revenues (in proportion to their total revenues) >5% from activities in the sector of pornography.
	> Each security receives two scores, one based on the Sustainable Devel- opment Goal 6: Clean Water and Sanitation and one based one the Sus- tainable Development Goal 14: Life Below Water Scores. Each score is standardized by the respective sector in the index universe. Both scores are standardized by subtracting the average score per sector and dividing by the standard deviation of scores in the respective sector. All securities with a sector standardized Clean Water and Sanitation Score below 1 or a sector standardized Life Below Water Score below or equal to 0 are ex- cluded.

Data Input	The data used to construct the index is sourced externally from Institutional Shareholder Services Inc.
Verification and quality of data	The provider of ESG-related data input is selected by the Administrator based on an assessment of its existing processes in order to ensure the reliability and representativeness of the ESG-related data. The data provider has established processes in accordance with accepted and established market standards that ensure the permanent quality and reliability of the ESG-data provided.
