	> Exclusion of companies with higher carbon emissions compared to their peers.
	Exclusion of companies with direct involvement in controversies which negatively affect biodiversity-sensitive areas and where remedial measures have not been implemented
	> Exclusion of companies with significant negative impact on a Sustainable Development Goal
	> Exclusion of companies with Environmental rating of D- or lower
List of social factors considered	Exclusion of companies with verified ongoing failure to respect established international norms. The core normative framework consists of the Prin- ciples of the UN Global Compact, the OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises and the UN Guiding Principles for Business and Human Rights.
	> Exclusion of companies that are involved in the production development or maintenance of Anti-personnel Mines, Biological or chemical weapons, Cluster munitions, Depleted uranium, Nuclear Weapons, or any other weapon that violate humanitarian principles through normal use or produce or de- velop key and dedicated components for controversial weapons or are in- volved in the production and/or services tailor made for the defence indus- try or the military.
	> Exclusion of companies that derive more than 5% of their revenues the from involvement in the production of Civilian Firearms, Tobacco, Alcohol or Fossil Fuels
	> Exclusion of companies that derive more than 10% of their total revenues from the production or 20% from the distribution, services or overall in the Alcohol, Tobacco, Pornography or Gambling Sector.

List of governance factors considered	> Exclusion of companies with zero reported board members
	> Exclusion of companies with Governance rating of D+ or lower
