List of environmental factors considered	> Exclusion of companies found to be in breach of the UN Global Compact Principles.
	> Exclusion of companies generating revenues (in proportion to their total revenues) >0% from coal mining and >20% from coal utilities, unless they show willingness to adapt
	> Exclusion of companies generating revenues (in proportion to their total revenues) > 0% from oil sands, unless they show willingness to adapt
List of social factors considered	> Exclusion of companies found to be in breach of the UN Global Compact Principles.
	> Exclusion of companies involved in the manufacturing of tobacco products.
	> Exclusion of companies based on the AFM guideline to ban manufacturers of cluster munitions. Biological and chemical-based weapons manufacturers and nuclear outside the NPT area as well as Anti-Personal Mines, incendiary weapons, blinding laser weapons, and booby traps.
List of governance factors considered	> Exclusion of companies found to be in breach of the UN Global Compact Principles.
