List of environmental factors considered	<ul style="list-style-type: none">> Remove any UNGC Violators.> Remove companies with controversies in issues such as operations and employee incidents, human rights, business ethics and water use.> Remove companies deriving more than 10% of its revenue from thermal coal extraction or more than 25% of its revenues based on generating electricity from thermal coal.> Remove companies deriving more than 10% of its revenues from oil and gas exploration in Arctic regions.> Remove companies deriving more than 10% of its revenues from oil sands extraction.> The index weights are determined by incorporating ESG Risk Ratings, ESG Risk Rating Momentum.> Additionally, the weights are also determined by incorporating Carbon Intensity and Carbon Risk Scores.
List of social factors considered	<ul style="list-style-type: none">> Remove any UNGC Violators.> Remove companies with controversies in issues such as operations and employee incidents, human rights, business ethics and water use.> Remove companies with any detectable involvement in the core weapon system, or components/services of the core weapon system that are considered tailor-made and essential for the lethal use of the weapon.> Remove any company which manufactures tobacco products, derives more than 10% of its revenues from supplying tobacco-related products/services or the distribution and/or retail sale of tobacco products.> The index weights are determined by incorporating ESG Risk Ratings, ESG Risk Rating Momentum.
