	> Exclusion of any companies that fail to comply with the social-related prin- ciples of the United Nations Global Compact
List of governance factors considered	 Exclusion of companies showing any involvement in systematic violations of accepted business practices.
	Exclusion of companies showing any involvement in accounting fraud and corruption: non-compliance with legal requirements.
	Exclusion of companies showing any involvement in use of derivatives on food commodities to generate a speculative profit in a mutual fund.
	 Exclusion of companies showing any involvement in disregard of legal reg- ulations.
	> Exclusion of any companies that fail to comply with the governance-related principles of the United Nations Global Compact.
