	Exclusion of companies generating revenues from the production of nuclear power or uranium, or >5% from key components for nuclear power stations.
	Exclusion of companies involved in controversial environmental practices either immediately causing the impact or suppliers / subcontractors caus- ing the impact.
List of social factors considered	Only companies with a "Prime" Rating in the ISS ESG Corporate Rating are eligible for inclusion. Companies are categorized as "Prime" if they achieve or exceed the sector-specific performance requirements defined by ISS ESG based on the ESG risk exposure and impact of their respective business model and value chain (absolute best-in-class approach). Prime companies rank among the sustainability leaders in their industry.
	> Exclusion of companies generating revenue with drugs for abortion or clin- ics generating revenue with abortion.
	> Exclusion of companies specialized in embryonic research.
	 Exclusion of companies generating revenues from controversial forms of gambling or >20% from other forms of gambling.
	Exclusion of companies generating revenue >5% with the production of alcohol (beer / wine and high-proof beverages / foodstuffs).

	> Exclusion of companies generating revenues from the production of Ge-
	netically Modified Organism (GMO).
	 Exclusion of companies generating net sales from the production of weapons (systems) or outlawed weapons, or >5% from the production of other ar- maments.
	 Exclusion of companies generating revenues from the production or >10% from distribution of pornography.
	Exclusion of companies generating net sales >5% from the production of end products or components / accessories in the sector of tobacco.
	 Exclusion of companies violating human rights or companies whose sup- pliers / subcontractors violate human rights.
	Exclusion of companies that violate, or companies whose suppliers / sub- contractors violate, the labor rights of freedom of association, forced la- bor, child labor, discrimination or other areas.

Verification and quality of data	The provider of ESG-related data input is selected by the Administrator based on an assessment of its existing processes in order to ensure the reliability and representativeness of the ESG-related data. The data provider has established processes in accordance with accepted and established market standards that ensure the permanent quality and reliability of the ESG-data provided.
